

<p><b>ARTICLE 1 HUMAN DIGNITY</b></p> <p>When children are born, they are free and each should be treated in the same way. They have reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a friendly manner.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 2 NONDISCRIMINATION</b></p> <p>Everyone can claim the following rights, despite a different sex, a different skin colour, speaking a different language, thinking different things, believing in another religion, owning more or less, being born in another social group, or coming from another country. It also makes no difference whether the country you live in is independent or no</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 3 RIGHT TO LIFE</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 4 NO SLAVERY</b></p> <p>No one shall be held in slavery or servitude; slavery and the slave trade shall be prohibited in all their forms.</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 5 NO TORTURE</b></p> <p>No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 6 PERSON BEFORE THE LAW</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law.</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 7 EQUAL BEFORE THE LAW</b></p> <p>The law is the same for everyone; it should be applied in the same way to all.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 8 LEGAL PROTECTION</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to an effective remedy by the competent national tribunals for acts violating the fundamental rights granted him by the constitution or by law.</p>

<p><b>ARTICLE 9 NO UNFAIR DETAINMENT</b></p> <p>Nobody has the right to put you in prison, to keep you there, or to send you away from your country unjustly, or without good reason.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 10 THE RIGHT TO TRIAL</b></p> <p>Everyone is entitled in full equality to a fair and public hearing by an independent and impartial tribunal, in the determination of his rights and obligations and of any criminal charge against him.</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 11 PRESUMPTION OF INNOCENCE</b></p> <p>You should be considered innocent until it can be proved that you are guilty. If you are accused of a crime, you should always have the right to defend yourself. Nobody has the right to condemn you and punish you for something you have not done.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 12 RIGHT TO PRIVACY</b></p> <p>You have the right to ask to be protected if someone tries to harm your good name, enter your house, open your letters, or bother you or your family without a good reason.</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 13 FREEDOM TO MOVE</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to freedom of movement and residence within the borders of each state. Everyone has the right to leave any country, including his own, and to return to his country.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 14 THE RIGHT TO SEEK A SAFE PLACE TO LIVE</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries asylum from persecution. This right may not be invoked in the case of prosecutions genuinely arising from non-political crimes or from acts contrary to the purposes and principles of the United Nations.</p>

<p><b>ARTICLE 15 RIGHT TO A NATIONALITY</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to a nationality. No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his nationality nor denied the right to change his nationality. Du hast das Recht, einem Land anzugehören.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 16 GENDER EQUALITY</b></p> <p>Men and women of full age, without any limitation due to race, nationality or religion, have the right to marry and to found a family. They are entitled to equal rights as to marriage, during marriage and at its dissolution. Marriage shall be entered into only with the free and full consent of the intending spouses. The family is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by society and the State</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 17 PROPERTY RIGHT</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to own property alone as well as in association with others. No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his property.</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 18 FREEDOM OF THOUGHT</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance.</p>
<p><b>ARTICLE 19 FREEDOM OF OPINION AND INFORMATION</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to freedom of opinion and expression; this right includes freedom to hold opinions without interference and to seek, receive and impart information and ideas through any media and regardless of frontiers..</p>	<p><b>ARTICLE 20 RIGHT TO PEACEFUL ASSEMBLY</b></p> <p>Everyone has the right to freedom of peaceful assembly and association. No one may be compelled to belong to an association.</p>

**ARTICLE 21  
RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE IN  
GOVERNMENT**

Everyone has the right to take part in the government of his country, directly or through freely chosen representatives. Everyone has the right of equal access to public service in his country. The will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government; this will shall be expressed in periodic and genuine elections which shall be by universal and equal suffrage and shall be held by secret vote or by equivalent free voting procedures.

**ARTICLE 22  
RIGHT TO SOCIAL SECURITY**

The society in which you live should help you to develop and to make the most of all the advantages (culture, work, social welfare) which are offered to you and to all the men and women in your country. Dach über dem Kopf, genug Geld zum Leben und medizinische Hilfe, wenn du krank bist.

**ARTICLE 23  
WORKER`S RIGHTS**

You have the right to work, to be free to choose your work, to get a salary which allows you to support your family. If a man and a woman do the same work, they should get the same pay. All people who work have the right to join together to defend their interests.

**ARTICLE 24  
RIGHT TO REST AND LEISURE**

Everyone has the right to rest and leisure, including reasonable limitation of working hours and periodic holidays with pay.

**ARTICLE 25  
RIGHT TO ADAEQUATE STANDARD  
OF LIVING**

You have the right to have whatever you need so that you and your family: do not fall ill or go hungry; have clothes and a house; and are helped if you are out of work, if you are ill, if you are old, if your wife or husband is dead, or if you do not earn a living for any other reason you cannot help. The mother who is going to have a baby, and her baby should get special help. All children have the same rights, whether or not the mother is married.

**ARTICLE 26  
RIGHT TO EDUCATION**

You have the right to go to school. Primary schooling should be free. You should be able to learn a profession or continue your studies as far as you wish. At school, you should be able to develop all your talents and you should be taught to get along with others, whatever their race, religion or the country they come from. Your parents have the right to choose how and what you will be taught at school.

**ARTICLE 27  
RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE IN  
CULTURAL LIFE**

You have the right to share in your community's arts and sciences, and any good they do. Your works as an artist, writer, or a scientist should be protected, and you should be able to benefit from them.

**ARTICLE 28  
RIGHT TO A FAIR AND FREE WORLD**

So that your rights will be respected, there must be an 'order' which can protect them. This 'order' should be local and worldwide.

**ARTICLE 29  
COMMUNITY DUTIES**

You have duties towards the community within which your personality can only fully develop. The law should guarantee human rights. It should allow everyone to respect others and to be respected.

**ARTICLE 30  
INTERPRETATION**

In all parts of the world, no society, no human being, should take it upon her or himself to act in such a way as to destroy the rights which you have just been reading about.


